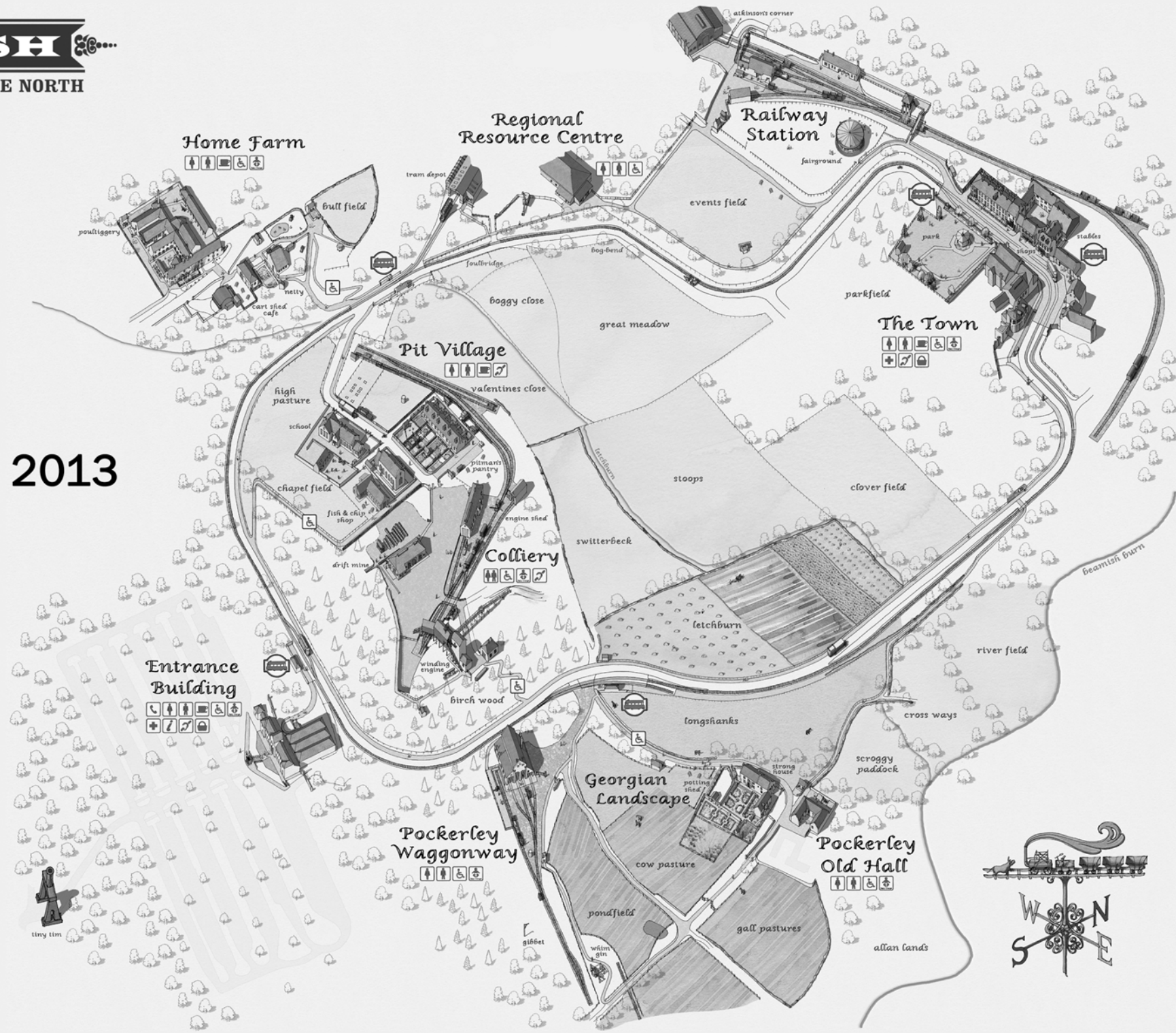

Getting Around Beamish

Access Information

- An Access Information leaflet is available at Admissions.
- An Accessible Bus is available. Please ask any member of staff for details.
- To create an authentic feel, a variety of ground surfaces have been used, some of which are uneven by nature.
- There are steep slopes in places and some buildings feature exhibits with stepped access.
- Photo files are available for those exhibits situated at first floor level.
- If you use a motorised wheelchair or scooter please use the pathways rather than the roads.
- With a relaxed pace The Town is around 20 minutes walk away from the Entrance.

The Beamish Tramway and Bus Service

- Trams and the Accessible Bus operate a regular service throughout the day.
- Folded buggies/wheelchairs may be carried as space permits and at the driver's discretion.
- From 4.30pm all trams terminate at the Entrance.
- The last tram from The Town is at 5.00pm.
- An Accessible Bus service links The Town with The Pit Village from 10.00am - 4.30pm. From 4.30pm the service changes to operate between The Pit Village and the Entrance.

- In The Town, our very own pub. Open 11.00am - 4.30pm (Sunday opens at 12 noon).
- In The Pit Village, offering a takeaway range of hot & cold snacks and drinks. Open 10.00am - 5.00pm.
- At Home Farm, offering a takeaway range of hot & cold snacks and drinks. Open 10.00am - 5.00pm.
- In the Pit Village, enjoy fish & chips cooked in real beef dripping, wrapped in newspaper of course! Open 11.30am - 3.30pm.

Other useful information



- Smoking is not permitted in buildings, tram shelters or on Museum transport.
